NEET 2017

The Karnataka Examinations Authority (KEA) (earlier CET Cell) has been conducting entrance examinations for various professional courses like MBBS/BDS/Bv.Sc/B.E/Farm Science, ISMH and Pharma courses. Now, as per the orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court and further ordinance passed by Government of India, from 2017-18 onwards there will be a separate examination conducted by CBSE Board ie., NEET (National Eligibility Entrance Test) for medical and dental courses. The candidates who are willing to take admissions for Medical and Dental courses must necessarily qualify in the NEET examination which will be conducted by the CBSE Board, New Delhi.

It is cleared that from 2017-18 academic year onwards, KEA will not conduct entrance examination for admission to Medical and Dental courses. But, CET examination will be as usual for Karnataka students for others like Engineering, ISMH, Farm science, Bv.Sc and Pharma courses. To this effect this separate notification will be issued by KEA probably in the month of November/December 2016. The candidates who seek to take admission in above mentioned courses have to compulsorily appear for entrance examinations conducted by KEA. The candidates who are taking NEET examinations can also take Karnataka CET examinations separately. The candidates who qualify in the NEET examination from Karnataka State are eligible to select Medical or Dental seats based on the NEET score. KEA will prepare the merit list based on the NEET score and allot the Government quota seats of Medical and Dental to the eligible candidates. This allotment will be subject to the directions issued by the Government from time to time. Merit List will be prepared by KEA and the same merit list will be applied for allotment of seats for Government share to medical and Dental courses.

Admission to Government seats shall be made in accordance with the Karnataka Selection of Candidates for admission to Government seats in professional Educational Institution Rules 2006 as amended from time to time".

Since NEET is being conducted for the first time in Karnataka for Government shared seats, KEA would like to enlighten the students details relating to NEET exams as follows:

Information on NEET Examination

What is NEET?

NEET (National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test) is the selection test for admission to Medical and Dental Colleges across the country.

Who is eligible to write NEET?

Eligibility criteria to wirte NEET is candidates must have passed or appearing in 2017 for class 10+2 or equivalent exam with Physics, Chemistry, Biology / Bio-Technology (PCB) subjectes with requisite percentage as per their category.

What is the pattern of NEET?

The NEET consists a total of 180 questions in four subjects, Physics (45), Chemistry (45), Botany (45) and Zoology (45). Candidates have to answer 180 questions in 180 minutes in a single sitting. Each correct answer is awarded 4 marks and for each woring answer 1 mark is deducted from the marks earned.

When is the test?

The Examinations is held in the 1st week of May and is conducted by CBSE Board.

- 1. Government Medical & Dental colleges in Karnataka (85% seats)
- 2. Private Colleges having Govt quota in Karnataka
- 3. Government Medical and Dental colleges in rest of India (15% seats)
- 4. IISc
